

Inpatient Rehabilitation Outcome Report Snapshot January 2018 – December 2018

Gundersen's Inpatient Rehab is a 16-bed, multi-disciplinary program dedicated to acute rehabilitation services. In January 2018-December 2018 we helped 416 patients ranging from 16 to over 90 years old with an average age of 67.

Each patient's program is customized to meet his or her needs by integrating several different disciplines. The team may include:

- Physiatrist or rehabilitation physician
- Certified rehabilitation nurses
- Physical therapist for mobility, balance and coordination
- Occupational therapist for daily tasks such as eating, toileting, bathing and dressing
- Speech-language pathologist for language skills and swallowing if needed
- Social worker and/or care coordinator to arrange for the help, adaptive equipment and services needed at home
- Other specialty services as needed

We primarily serve patients in our Tri-state service area including southwest Wisconsin, southeast Minnesota and northeast Iowa, but we welcome patients and their families, no matter where they live, who are looking for a highly-rated, comprehensive inpatient rehab experience.

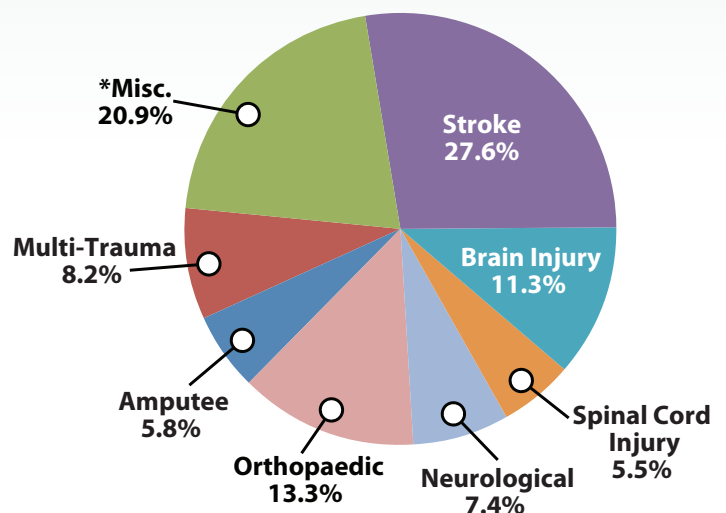
We treat patient with a variety of conditions as shown in this graph

Outcomes

- Average length of stay for all 416 patients was 12 days (averages vary by diagnosis)
- 90 percent of patients were able to return to a home setting directly after discharge
- Our functional improvement scores are consistently better than other regional rehab facilities
- More than 80 percent of our patients consistently rate their overall care "very good" or "excellent" on satisfaction survey
